GLOBAL CENTRE FOR PLURALISM TO HOST 2019 PLURALISM AWARD CEREMONY RECOGNIZING WORLDWIDE LEADERS OF INCLUSION

On November 20, 2019 in Ottawa, Canada, His Highness the Aga Khan will present the Global Pluralism Award

November 6, 2019 (Ottawa, Canada) – The <u>Global Centre for Pluralism</u>, founded by His Highness the Aga Khan and the Government of Canada, will recognize the recipients of the 2019 <u>Global Pluralism Award</u> at a ceremony on November 20, 2019 in Ottawa, Canada at the Delegation of the Ismaili Imamat. The three winners will each be granted CAN \$50,000 and inkind support to advance their work to build more peaceful, sustainable and successful societies.

The Award will be presented to three winners and seven honourable mention recipients. The winners are:

- <u>Deborah Ahenkorah</u>, a young Ghanaian social entrepreneur and book publisher bringing African children's stories to life;
- the <u>Center for Social Integrity</u>, an organization, founded by a Rohingya humanitarian, giving youth from conflict-affected regions in Myanmar the skills to be leaders for change amidst the many overlapping conflicts ongoing in the country;
- '<u>Learning History that is not yet History</u>', a network of history educators and specialists in the Balkans pioneering a new approach to teaching the controversial history of conflict.
